De acordo com Orwell, o livro reflete os acontecimentos que se seguiram depois da Revolução Comunista de 1917 e, em consequência, à era estalinista na União Soviética, que se tornou uma ditadura brutal, construída sobre o culto à personalidade e reforçada por um reinado de terror. A obra é uma sátira e uma crítica contundente sobre o que acontece quando um grupo revolucionário chega ao poder.
